A Reading from The Prophet Ezekiel, Chapter 18: verses 1-4, 25-32.

The word of the LORD came to me: What do you mean by repeating this proverb concerning the land of Israel, "The parents have eaten sour grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge"? As I live, says the Lord GOD, this proverb shall no more be used by you in Israel. A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Philippians, Chapter 2: verses 1-13.

If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Invitation to the Eucharist

As Jesus was, we are called to times of service, but also to solitude, to vast stores of unused quiet to be with You, to immensities of rivers, oceans and skies that enlarge our souls and remind us of eternity, and of what passes, but with promise.

And so we come together today to receive your Word and join with Saints and Angels in a chorus of praise and thanks that rings through eternity, lifting our voices to magnify you as we sing:

Among friends, gathered around a table, Jesus took bread, and broke it. "This is my body broken for you."

Later he took a cup of wine and said, "This is the new relationship with God made possible because of my death. Take it all of you, so that I may be present in your midst."

Jesus, Savior of the world, All: **Have mercy upon us.**

Jesus Lord of heaven, All: Grant us peace.

In honor of St Francis, whose Feast Day is October 4, pet blessings will be distributed today during announcements by the young people. The day is also the official end of the Season of Creation.

During the Season of Creation online, we have highlighted a specific environmental area. This week's topic is deforestation. Forests play a vital role in maintaining the balance of the Earth's ecosystems. They provide habitat for more than half of all terrestrial species, help filter pollutants out of the air and water, and prevent soil erosion.

Deforestation is a shorthand term for tree loss. The Earth loses more than 18 million acres of forestland every year—an area larger than Ireland. In addition to the environmental devastation, forest fires directly affect the lives of people. The total area affected by forest fires in the western US has increased by more than a factor of six in the past two decades. This trend has affected air quality. Since 2016, air quality progress has significantly slowed in 30 states. In 11 others, it began to reverse.
